Climate Resilient Riparian Systems Lead (CR2SL) partnership between Ecology, Bonneville Environmental Foundation, and the State Conservation Commission Colin Hume, Puget Sound Recovery Lead, WA Department of Ecology	The Climate Resilient Riparian Systems Lead (CR2SL) partnership with Ecology, Bonneville Environmental Foundation, and the State Conservation Commission is a new \$30 million, 5-year program investment by EPA that is modeled off of the SILs and will largely be pass-through funding for innovative approaches to get more riparian buffers planted. The funding comes through the federal Bipartisan Infrastructure Law. They are building out their partner engagement plan and one early component they are trying to get rolling are some engagement workshops where local implementation partners can provide feedback about barriers, challenges, funding gaps, and just general needs within the riparian space. The Sno-Still LIO hosted such a workshop in the fall along with the Lead Entity and other partners, and it was really beneficial. He noted that the fish are coming back to the Elwha River, and that everyone in the room and within the Strait ERN played a part in making that happen. Presentation & discussion: Marine Carbon Removal Technologies

Sara Nawaz, Institute for Responsible Carbon Removal, American University Sara Nawaz is a social scientist and the Director of Research at American University's Institute for Responsible Carbon Removal. She is leading a research study that aims to explore community views on a new set of technologies called marine carbon dioxide removal, which are increasingly being explored for possible future deployment in the Salish Sea.

She reached out to the Strait Ecosystem Recovery Network hoping to conduct a research workshop in the Sequim and Port Angeles area. Most people don't know about these technologies now, and the goal of this work is to begin discussing the possibilities of this potential future sector with local affected communities before a specific agenda gets set for the sector. This research project does not have any ties to existing groups that are looking to deploy these technologies—our goal with this work is to explore whether or not there might be support for further research or deployment of them and any conditions that might need to be met for further exploration of these technologies to potentially be viewed as appropriate in the region.
